HOLY WEEK Year A, Sun. March 29th.- Sat. Apr. 4th.

First Reading

Isaiah ch.50, vv.4-7
The latter part of the
prophecy of Isaiah
contains 4 canticles
written in the name
of the 'Servant of
Yahweh'. These
picture a servant
suffering in the
name of Yahweh
God on behalf of all
His people. The
servant of God is
one who carries out
God's mission here
on earth. Given the
nature of man's
response to God, it
comes about that
this servant is
marked by his
suffering. In this
way the Servant
becomes a model
and forerunner of
the one who was to
come, namely Jesus
the Messiah. Hence
many prophetic texts
are used in our
liturgy at this time.

Jesus enters Jerusalem in glory



Second reading:
Philippians ch. 2, vv.6-11.

Paul tells us straight out how
Christ "emptied Himself by
taking the form of a servant". In
this he assimilates Jesus Christ
with the "suffering servant" of
Isaiah. Like that servant, Christ,
though God, takes on human
form and became one of us. And
because Christ submitted to His
Father's will He has been most
highly exalted and has led the
way for us to follow Him to
glory.

Palm Gospel

Matt. ch 21 vv.1-11
We begin our
liturgy today with
Christ's triumphal
entry to Jerusalem.
A play-write could
not have presented
a better drama of
which Matthew
gives the most
complete account.
We join with the
crowds of
Jerusalem in
waving our palms
as the Lord's
anointed enters our
liturgy on a
borrowed donkey.

Passion Gospel

Matt. Ch.20, vv.14-66
The tragic story is
so familiar and yet
it is always new.
The humility and
nobility of Jesus
Christ shines
through all the
insults and bullying
by so many who

had so recently
greeted him with
love.
